RELATING TO PUBLIC OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES; PRESCRIBING CUALIFICATIONS FOR PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT, AND AMENDING SECTION 38-201, ARIZONA RE-VISED STATUTES.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:
- Section 1. Section 38-201, Arizona Revised Statutes, is
 - amended to read:
- 4 38-201. General qualifications
- 5 A. Every officer shall be not less than twenty-one years
- 6 of age, a citizen of the United States and a resident of this
- 7 state.

- B. No person is eligible to any office, employment or
- 9 service in any public institution in the state, or in any of
- 10 the several counties thereof, of any kind or character, whether
- ll by election, appointment or contract, unless he is a citizen
- 12 of the United States, but the provisions of this subsection
- 13 shall not apply to the employment of any teacher, instructor
- 14 or professor authorized to teach in the United States under
